## 1. Background:

"Aadhar Shodh Sansthan" (Aadhar Research Institute) a grass root level voluntary organization was registered in late 1991 under Rajasthan Societies Registration Act 1958. Organization has started working with the support of local community to promote all round development of rural society through an integrated development approach.

"Aadhar's" main working area is Chaksu and Dausa blocks of Jaipur and Dausa districts respectively, the two neighboring districts in the eastern part of Rajasthan. Climate of these districts is subjected to extremeness of cold and hot and except for the monsoon season weather is dry. Rainfall of the area is quite low leading to severe scarcity of water thus affecting agricultural yield, poor availability of fodder and drinking water. These factors force a large section of the society to migrate to neighboring cities and states for livelihood.

## 2. Objectives:

Being a grass root level Voluntary Organization / NGO, "Aadhar" serves the underserved and unserved sections of rural society with focus on the following major objectives:

- To undertake all-round development of the socio-economically backward and other deprived sections of the society
- To provide formal and non-formal education through active participation of various groups of the community
- To create awareness about water conservation and safe drinking water to the local populace
- To enhance the worth and dignity of every woman through empowerment as well as to sensitize them on gender based issues, domestic violence, women's rights, etc.
- To capacity build various groups by organizing trainings, meetings, workshops, camps etc.
- To cooperate and collaborate with like-minded organizations, groups and institutes and assist in development of new groups
- To create awareness of the utility of solar energy, natural compost in place of fertilizers, rain water harvestings etc.



#### 3. Mission:

To mitigate the hardship of village community by undertaking integrated development activities.

## 4. Target beneficiaries:

Organization is working with the rural masses, mainly Women, Children and other weaker sections of the society through various development programmes.

#### 5. Thrust Areas:

- Water Conservation
- Women's Empowerment
- Education for drop out / working children
- Reproductive and Child Health Rights
- Adolescent Reproductive Health
- Gender based Issues
- Capacity building trainings, workshops. Orientations, etc.

#### 6. Location:

Registered office of the Organization is situated in village Radoli of block Chaksu of District Jaipur. It is around 55 Kilometers from city Jaipur. Campus is developed in 0.5 hectare of land. It is residential and having facilities for carrying out any kind of trainings, meetings and orientation programmes.

Campus has got ample space for games and sports. Water harvesting structure and solar lighting is available in the campus. Quite a good number of trees are planted in the campus.

## 8. Activities being carried out during 2014-2016

#### I) Water Conservation Project

#### **Chaksu Block**

- 3 Pond sites namely Sawai Jaisinghpura, Bapugaon and Rupahedi Kallan, which were being developed in the previous year, were strengthened by stone pitching on the boundaries and regular maintenance work was done in 2014-2015.
- Discussion of the moral and social duties towards the maintenance of pond and conservation of water were carried out with the villagers and Jal Samiti members.
- In the month of September 2014, a team from Coca-Cola India Foundation, Delhi visited village Bapugaon to inspect the pond structure and discuss its benefits with the villagers and Jal Samiti members. The team highly appreciated the thoughtfulness and dedication of the women of the village towards the idea of water conservation.

#### Niwai Block

The work of water conservation through revitalization of village ponds was carried forward in the Niwai Block of Tonk District with the support of Coca-Cola India Foundation. Hence, 5 villages were shortlisted namely, Bhurtia, Dayalpura, Brijlalpura, Suratrampura and Dahlod.

- Meetings were held with villagers about the project and its benefits.
- Environment building was done in 2 villages through puppet shows.
- Jal Samiti was formed with 10 members in each village through the consensus of villagers.
- Bank Account was opened for each jal Samiti so that transactions can be done.
- Members of Panchayati Raj (Sarpanch, Wardpanch) were informed about the work progress.
- Work of pond excavation was completed under the supervision of Jal Samiti.
- The structures were strengthened after first rainfall by placing hard red soil over the pond boundaries.

Shri Rajiv Gupta of Coca-Cola India Foundation visited 3 sites in Niwai block to inspect the structures and discuss its benefits with the villagers.



## Benefits of water conservation project:

- Water level in hand pumps and wells increased.
- Quality of water enhanced due to more rain water percolation
- Increased soil moisture helped in increasing the agricultural yield and thus promoting economic development of the area.

#### II) Women Empowerment programme

- Organization undertook survey of poor households in 20 villages in Niwai, Chaksu and Dausa block to help organize them in SHGs. 50 SHGs were formed in Chaksu block. Monthly meetings were organized and members were encouraged to participate and continue their monthly savings. This will help the women members by providing them financial security in the long run.
- Organization personnel helped in managing the internal loaning system of the SHGs and facilitated the opening of Bank Accounts for 7 SHGs.
- Women of 5 villages were surveyed for Handicraft training to enhance their livelihood. They were sent to SWRC, Tilonia for capacity building and training.



#### III) Education

- Organization conducted surveys in 7 villages for establishing Non-Formal Education centers for school drop-out students of 6-14 years of age. As a result 2 villages were shortlisted for establishment of the centers.
- Due to lack of quality education in Government schools, the children tend to stay away from schools and thus their learning is hampered right from their childhood. Organization conducted a 20-day research project in its campus to act as a bridge in their learning gap. Government school students were daily taught English, Maths and Science for 2 hours after their school timings. Students were highly motivated and enthusiastic about this endeavor.
- Organization conducted 3-months 'Computer Training' session for 20 adolescent boys in two batches to help them get acquainted with the basic operations of computer.

## IV) Survey

- Organization undertook survey for Girl child education for classes 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> in various Government schools to establish a center for their improved learning. Around 8 villages were covered under this survey and proposals were sent to various donor agencies.
- Surveys for night-school establishment were conducted in 6 villages and various meetings were organized with the villagers.
- Organization undertook survey for Anicut development and Pond revitalization projects in 15 villages of Niwai Block. Out of these 2 anicut sites and 5 pond sites were shortlisted.
- Water survey was carried out in various villages in response to the needs of the villagers and suggestions were given to them regarding the availability of water in their area. 15 tube-well and open-well points were identified through this survey.



## V) Revitalization of village ponds

## VI) Participation in other Government activities

## • Participation in meetings at Gram Panchayat levels

Organization personnel continuously interacted in Radoli and Bapugaon panchayat meetings to discuss Water, Health and Education related issues of the people. Villagers in 8 villages of these panchayats were informed about various Government schemes and their associated benefits.

## • Participated at Panchayat level during Immunization drives

Organization personnel helped in motivating and orienting villagers towards Immunization Camps, which are carried on by Government Health Providers like ANM and ASHA for proper vaccination of children and pregnant women. This helped in increasing the villager turnout in these camps.
